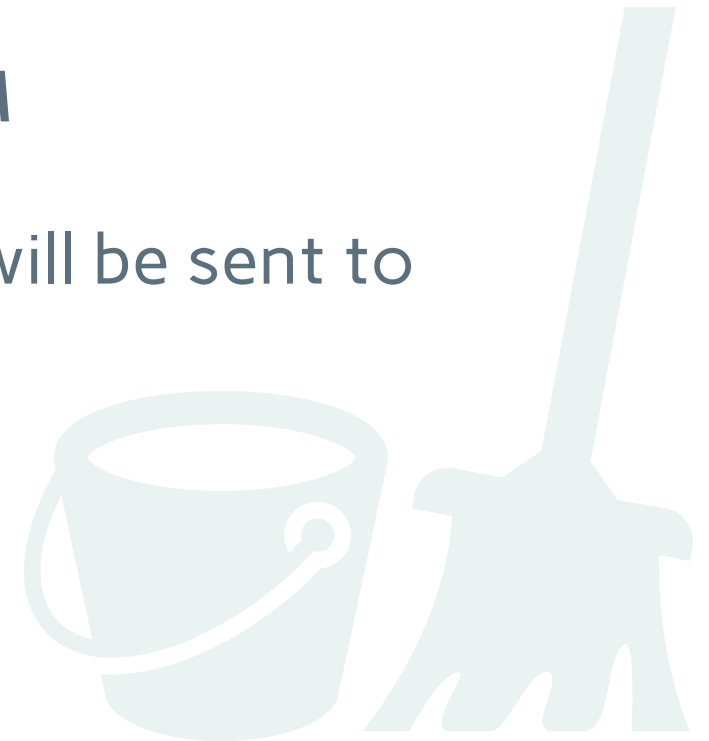

# QA Commons Mission

QA Commons' mission is to ensure all learners are prepared for the changing dynamics of the workforce and economy. We aspire to help people realize upward mobility by developing a foundation of employability skills needed by all workers in all jobs and careers.

Our focus is on the proficiencies employers say are most needed, which candidates often lack, and can be the most challenging to develop. Referred to as "employability skills," "soft skills," and "noncognitive skills," we characterize them as **Essential Employability Qualities (EEQs)**.



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# The Need

**92%** of executives say soft skills are equal to or more important than hard skills

- ▶ Integrated Support Services

# QA Commons Solutions

## 1 Assessment

Surveys engage instructors, advisors, and staff in identifying strengths and gaps in identifying strengths and gaps in delivering employability skills and career readiness services.

QA Commons develops a tailored technical assistance plan that identifies the steps needed to improve and align employability skills with courses and programs.

## 2 Technical Assistance & Professional Development

QA Commons delivers a set of individualized technical assistance tools, such as workshops, academies, and individualized coaching focused on embedding Essential Employability Qualities (EEQs) into curricula, effectively engaging employers, and integrating Employability Framework standards.

## 3 Full Framework Adoption

QA Commons awards EEQ Certification (EEQ CERT), which serves as an indicator of full Employability Framework adoption. It is the hallmark of quality in delivering education and training programs aligned to employability.
